# **INSTRUMENT INSTRUCTOR ONLY SESSION 1 & 2**

## **DUTIES**

#### **Instrument Instructors will:**

- Teach campers how to a play a specific instrument (vocals, guitar, bass, keys, drums, violin etc)
- Assist with gear movement and room set up for instrument instruction (includes setting up, plugging in gear, tuning instruments etc.)
- Assist with stage set up and stage management at showcase
- Be present during Monday morning activities to greet campers, help with way-finding and participate in "morning energizers"/group activity
- Assist campers during studio recording on Friday
- Assist with gear movement, as needed, from instrument instruction into band formation
- Communicate with band managers/girl power coach if concerns arise over the well-being/behavior of any camper(s) under your instruction.
- Collaborate and communicate effectively with your co-instructor and other staff members to role-model healthy interactions

### REQUIRED EXPERIENCE

Proficiency on instrument on which you are instructing and ability to teach that instrument to children. Previous teaching experience with children preferred.
